



Summary:

The Village of Whitefish Bay has been designated as a “Bird City Wisconsin” community since 2012. Nancy Sturino of the Whitefish Bay Garden Club completed a 2016 “Bird City” renewal application on behalf of the Village, which was submitted for review on January 28th.

The Bird City program provides direction, technical assistance, public attention and national recognition for municipalities striving to invest in the health of local bird species. Patterned after the Tree City USA program, the Bird City designation is a public demonstration of a community’s commitment to environmental, economic and aesthetic sustainability.

Bird City Wisconsin has developed a series of criteria to assess the degree to which communities invest in the health and well-being of bird species. In order to attain Bird City designation, a community must meet at least 7 of the 22 criteria outlined on the renewal application. As part of the application process, the Village of Whitefish Bay is required to submit an official resolution recognizing International Migratory Bird Day (IMBD). This year, the Village will observe IMDB during the month of May in conjunction with the Civic Foundation’s Green Day in the Bay event (date not yet finalized).

Recommendation:

Staff recommends approval of Resolution No. 2963 regarding International Migratory Bird Day.

Clark Dietz, Inc. has reviewed the eight (8) bids opened by the Village on February 5th 2016 for the aforementioned project. This project consists of water system, storm sewer, sanitary sewer improvements and reconstruction of Berkeley Blvd, Public Alleys, Elkhart Ave and Sheffield Ave, in the Village limits. The bid also included three alternates for pavement surface types. The lowest three (3) bidders are as follows:

The bidding process was structured to offer the Village the option for selecting either asphalt or concrete roadway construction. In general, we recommend the selection of the pavement surface that will result in lower long-term maintenance needs and costs. This approach can sometimes justify asphalt, and other times concrete, depending on the difference in price between the two. In this instance, the price for concrete pavement was **\$43 to \$47 per foot** higher than asphalt. So, to determine if the price increase makes sense for the Village:

- In general, an asphalt roadway would be expected to have a service life of 20 years WITHOUT major maintenance work. With maintenance, including crack seals, patching, spot overlays, and one round of mill and overlay, the life of the asphalt pavement can be extended to 30-35 years.
- A similar concrete roadway would be expected to have a service life of 30-35 years WITHOUT maintenance. With maintenance, including cyclical joint and crack sealing, and spot grinding and repairs, the service life of a concrete roadway can be extended to 40-50 years.
- In general, cyclical ongoing maintenance costs of asphalt or concrete roadways will be similar.
- Based on 2015 Village contract award, mill and overlay prices were **\$48 per foot** of roadway. One round of mill and overlay would be expected on our asphalt streets at about the 20 year mark.
- Therefore, if we accepted the asphalt roadway option, we would be expected to spend \$48 per foot in addition to our construction cost to attain a 30-35 year service life.
- In comparison, by accepting the concrete roadway now, we would spend an additional \$43-\$47 per foot and receive a 40-50 year service life.
- For about the cost of one round of mill and overlay, the concrete pavement option is expected to give us another 10-15 years of service over asphalt pavement. **We therefore recommend the selection of the concrete option in all streets.**

Award Recommendation:

Overall, the bids came in very favorably for the Village. Accordingly, Clark Dietz recommends that the Village award a contract to the low responsible bidder, **Advance Construction, Inc. of Green Bay, WI** in the amount of \$3,287,791.70 for the four Base Bid items, plus the Berkeley Concrete Alternate item. Additionally, we recommend that the amount \$312,208.30 (Approx. 9.5%) be included for construction contingencies.

With contingencies, the total recommended contract award amount is **not to exceed \$3,600,000**. The amount in the approved 2016 Village Budget for this total project is \$3,958,000.



The changes may be described as clarifications or editorial; substantive to address the increased flexibility allowed by Act 10 ; some new proposals to address areas not previously covered or needing elaboration; inclusion of the future changes to the health insurance program and benefits for new employees hired after January 1, 2016 previously approved by the Board; and the Addendums are brought up to date and integrated with the primary handbook. The Handbook is on the February 15, 2016 agenda for a work session. I will review each of the changes at that meeting. Further, Board members will be able to ask questions about any item in the Handbook and to suggest other changes.

I would suggest we invest an hour into this review in work session format and then we can finish with another hour on March 7. The revised Handbook would then be on the March 21 agenda for formal adoption.
