

NSFR OFFERS FREE HOME SAFETY INSPECTIONS

According to the National Fire Protection Agency, roughly three out of every five fire deaths occur in homes without smoke detectors or where detectors are not working.

Whitefish Bay residents are encouraged to take some time to ensure that you and your family are prepared for what to do in the event of an emergency in your home.

- Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms and outside sleeping areas.
- Carbon monoxide alarms should also be installed in a central location outside of each sleeping area and/or on every level of the home.
- Test smoke and carbon monoxide alarms once a month and replace batteries as needed.
- Talk with all household members about a fire escape plan and practice the plan twice a year.

The North Shore Fire/Rescue is proud to offer FREE home safety inspections. Fire Department personnel will conduct a con-

fidential inspection of your home. They will aid in identifying potential safety hazards and recommend corrective solutions.

Some areas of focus during a home inspection include:

- Presence and location and testing of smoke and carbon monoxide detection
- Recommendations for safe cooking
- Exploring trip and fall hazards in the home
- How to react when an emergency strikes (escape planning and/or fire department notification plan)
- Common issues related to heating, cooling and washing and drying clothes
- Answering questions about health or safety and providing resources when fire department personnel are unable to answer

SAVE THE DATE FOR BAYSHORE TOWN CENTER SAFETY DAY!

Now that winter is behind us, are you, your family, and friends, looking to venture out of the house? North Shore Fire/Rescue and all of the North Shore law enforcement agencies have the perfect idea. All aspects of public safety will be represented, including law enforcement, fire protective services, emergency government, family service agencies, civic organizations, as well as corporations and businesses from the private sector.

In addition, Safety Day will once again host the Fire Explorer Combat Challenge. This is the seventh year for the challenge and the third year that the event will run in conjunction with Bayshore Safety Day. The challenge begins at 9:00 am, and will run until approximately 2:30 pm. Last year, more than 70 competitors went head to head in individual, team and relay events. These young adults, ages 14-21, came from departments across Wisconsin and Illinois. The event mimics the professional combat challenge that is often referred to by ESPN as the "Toughest Two Minutes in Sports." Competitors take on several events that simulate common firefighting tasks like

Section 15.11(B)(7) of the Municipal Code requires owners to keep their dog on a leash (6 feet or less in length) whenever the dog is off the owner's property. DOG PARK ETIQUETTE 101

Milwaukee County is home to several fantastic dog parks, a great way to let your dog burn off energy in a safe, fenced-in area. Please keep the following in mind when you visit the dog park.

1. Please clean up after your dog! Dog waste is a source of several diseases and internal parasites. For everyone's health and safety, please clean up.
2. You need a permit for the dog park! Many people are unaware that you need a permit that includes a tag for your dog's collar. This helps support the maintenance of the dog parks and proves that your dog is vaccinated against rabies. With puppies, most veterinary professionals recommend waiting until your puppy has finished its series of puppy vaccinations, at approximately four months, before a first visit to the dog park.
3. Do not bring food to the dog park! It can cause scuffles between dogs.
4. You are encouraged to bring water.
5. Knowing your dog's tolerance level for strangers and other dogs is incredibly important! If you know your dog is afraid of people or is not tolerant of other dogs, you might decide to go to the dog



park when there are fewer people and less dogs around. Ultimately, it is up to you to make sure that your dog is not put in a situation that could be dangerous

to other animals or people. If your dog behaves inappropriately, you must immediately remove your dog from the park.

6. Most animals at the dog park tend to already have been spayed or neutered. However, if your own animal is still intact, please keep an eye on your pet while it plays. Females in heat should never be brought to the dog park!

Dog parks are a great place for both people and their dogs to socialize, when used safely and properly. Dog park permits are available at Milwaukee Area Domestic Control Commission (MADACC) seven days a week for only \$25 (\$5 for each additional dog). Visit us at 3839 W. Growing the Hansen Way

Growth gives purpose to one's life, even though significant growth is inevitably preceded by uncertainty, by the unknown. The unknown might keep someone in a rut, or forging into the unknown can lead to tremendous growth. A family that epitomizes the latter is the Hansens.

Although as teenagers Tim and Gina both lived in nearby Iowa towns, they didn't meet each other until they began separate journeys to Washington, D.C., where their paths would merge into one. Gina interned for William Cohen, then a Senator for Maine, and later worked for Charles Grassley, an Iowa Senator. Concurrently, Tim in-

terned on the House Banking Committee.

Thanks to a mutual friend, Gina and Tim were expected to attend a very rainy baseball game with several other friends. Despite Tim's reluctance to sit through the rain, Tim bought a two dollar poncho (the umbrellas were sold-out), took several metros, and finally met the friends at an apartment before the game. "When I walked in," said Tim, "Gina was there, sitting on the floor reading a book." Gina continued, "It was love at first sight, poncho and all." They were engaged six months later.

Gina and Tim yearned for a family but did not feel Washington, D.C., was suitable for doing

so. They moved to Milwaukee when Tim was recruited by a law firm, Michael, Best & Friedrich, LLP. They chose Whitefish Bay because, as Tim described, "I turned onto Silver Spring during a mid-December snowfall. It was like someone put a Norman Rockwell painting in a snow globe."

They purchased a home, developed immediate rapport with neighbors, and set the stage to begin a family . . . or so they thought. Growth in their marriage necessarily meant having children, so imagine their heartache when the couple was diagnosed with infertility issues. It forced Gina and Tim to rethink their whole life.

"So we had to go back to square one and reex-



amine all the assumptions we had about how our family life was going to look," reflected Gina. "So I said 'Okay God, if it's not part of Your plan for us to have kids then so be it.' I was sincere and willing to find peace in forgoing having the family I thought I would have, but that didn't feel right either. Then the idea of adoption came to us—it just clicked. It felt like the right thing." It was.

Today, they're blessed with four children, three adopted and one biological. The oldest, Michael, is eight-years-old; twins Delia and Samantha are five; and Helene almost three. Tim noted, "We wouldn't want it any other way. It all happened the way it did for a reason."

Gina agrees. "I feel being a stay at home mom is my vocation and I am doing exactly what I am meant to do. It is said that children are a gift. If they were a gift like a birthday gift they would be the crummiest gift ever. Who needs a gift that is going to pee on your floor and throw up on your clothes and keep you up half the night for the first year of its life? The real gift of my children is that they forced me to confront my own selfishness. They force me to bend and that whole process has made me a better person, to grow spiritually and in maturity."


There was another issue of growth—Tim's vocation. A litigation attorney has many demands, so during the height of the recession, and then with three young kids, Tim left a well-established law firm. "Ironically, I left to work as an in-house corporate lawyer in hopes of slowing the pace a

little," said Tim, so in 2011 he founded his own firm, Hansen Reynolds Dickinson Crueger, LLC. "The next thing I knew I was a full time litigator at a firm again! And now I work harder than ever. But it is incredibly satisfying. It's very, very different when it's your own—doesn't feel like work—it's more an extension of yourself."

It was another leap of faith. "Who else leaves a partnership at an old line firm at the height of the recession to hang a shingle with no clients?" quipped Tim. And yet, Gina stated, confidently, "It was the best risk we ever took. When big decisions have come our way, the right decision seems to come fairly easily and the pathway pretty clear. We didn't feel any turmoil. We just knew everything would work out and there was nothing to fear." Today, the firm has 19 lawyers with offices in Milwaukee, Madison, and Chicago.

Satisfaction with their life translates into a healthy environment for their children, where like their parents, the kids are encouraged to grow together and help each other, through cooking, hiking, building, artwork, and much more. The children help each other get dressed in the morning and with chores. With hopes for future growth, Tim and Gina explained, "We have this list, our 20/25 list. It is a list of things we want us to do as a family by the time Michael (our oldest) is 25 and Helene (our youngest) is 20."

With the future in mind, for the Hansens, past growth propels future growth, in love, in faith, and most importantly—together. •

The Whitefish Bay Civic Foundation will be hosting an Eco Fair featuring exhibitors from the Whitefish Bay Garden Club, Whitefish Bay Farmer’s Market, Wisconsin Bike Federation, Village Ace/Outdoor Living and the Whitefish Bay Community Garden. Enjoy coffee and hot chocolate from Stone Creek Coffee. Catch up with neighbors while your kids explore the Speleo Cave and the Natural Playscape.

New to the event this year is the Whitefish Bay Birdhouse Community Art Project, a silent auction that will kick off Green Day. Bid on a beautiful birdhouse designed by a local artist and support Whitefish Bay’s official status as a Bird City. All proceeds from the silent auction will benefit the Whitefish Bay Civic Foundation and the Whitefish Bay Garden Club.

Village Ace/Outdoor Living will be collecting the following items:

- CFLs (Compact Fluorescent Bulbs) - not fluorescent tubes
- 20 pound propane tanks - not small cylinders
- Lead/Acid Batteries - not small flashlight/watch batteries
- Village Outdoor will distribute instructions on how to drop off old oil and gas at their location, 6075 North Green Bay Avenue, Glendale, WI

The Wisconsin Bike Federation will be on hand at Green Day to collect used bikes. All donated bikes will be tuned and repaired, and then distributed to children throughout the Milwaukee area through the Bike Federation’s Safe Routes to School Program. The program promotes healthy lifestyle choices through cycling to promote exercise and transportation, while teaching kids about safe biking practices.

Habitat for Humanity will also be there to accept donations of household goods, clothing, kitchen items, baby toys and electronics.

In addition, the Friends of the Whitefish Bay Public Library are looking for your used books. Drop them off at Green Day for someone else to enjoy.

WHITEFISH BAY HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

PRESERVING YOUR HISTORIC BUILDING



Whitefish Bay is rich in historic properties. In the downtown business district, nearly 80% of the properties have been identified by the State Historical Society as historic structures. Of the Bay's 4,000 homes, about 2,700 homes, or 67%, also have been determined to be historic. Furthermore, nearly 2,000 homes are in potential historic districts which, when they are so designated, will qualify their owners for 25% income tax credits for maintenance and repairs. For commercial properties, the income tax credit is 40%.

If you own a historic building—and in Whitefish Bay that means two out of three of us do—you already know it deserves special care and attention to preserve its history and charm. This is especially true when you need to make repairs or update the property. Whether it is an 1870s farmhouse, such as those along Hampton Road, Santa Monica Boulevard or Day Avenue, a former schoolhouse, such as the ones on Beaumont Avenue or Santa Monica Boulevard, or a 1930s commercial building, like those on Silver Spring Drive, you need solutions that are both financially sound and historically sensitive.

Fortunately, the State Historical Society, in the spring issue of its Wisconsin Columns newsletter, has introduced a brand new web resource to answer questions about how to make modifications to your historic building.

Go to www.wisconsinhistory.org/preserve-your-building, and you will find an image of a house divided into sections (like the image on this page). As you run your cursor over the house, the rooms or features you are interested in will light up. Click on that spot and you will



find several articles discussing the repair, improvement or update that you want to make. In total, you will find 145 concise yet thorough articles on topics ranging from window repair to replacing roofs and gutters, to how to work with your contractor. If you are a handyman, you will find several step-by-step articles for some common historic building projects illustrated by skilled tradespeople in detailed photographs. These articles come with a rating system to help you determine whether a project is a simple do-it-yourself repair or whether it is time to call a contractor.

If you do need a contractor, Historic Milwaukee, Inc., has recently published a preservation contractor directory. You can find it at www.historicmilwaukee.org/preservation/contractor-directory.

The State Historical Society created this resource, with the help of a matching grant from the US Department of Interior, to help historic building owners understand not only the techniques to preserve or restore a building, but also how historic buildings work, why preservation is important and tips on how to finance and plan a historic rehabilitation project—in the most efficient and cost-effective way.






