



Living, Playing and Working in Whitefish Bay

Our guess is that when many children see the cover of this issue, they will respond by yelling, "Hey, that's Mr. Lazovik!" Currently in his 12th year of teaching 2nd grade at Richards Elementary School, and having coached basketball at the high school for 10 years, Kevin Lazovik, has certainly had an impact on numerous local families. Kevin grew up in Whitefish Bay, and actually attended Richards, where he now teaches with some of the very same teachers that had him as a student. Teaching is the backbone to much of Kevin's life. His parents, Francine and Bill John, were both in education as well. Francine was a preschool teacher for over 15 years, and Bill taught industrial tech in the Whitefish Bay school district for over 30 years. Kevin met his energetic wife, Ginger, while they were both in graduate school at Cardinal Stritch University.

The Lazovik family are known in the community for helping others through their work and positive outlook. Ginger has a love for getting to know people, and earned her bachelors degree in music, specifically piano and voice. After graduating she began teaching piano lessons, and within a short time, her studio had blossomed to over 50 students per week. Around that same time, she started working in the fitness world and managed group



exercise programs, taught fitness classes and was a personal trainer. She continued to work part-time with piano and fitness while having their three children.

Through these jobs she realized her love of sales, marketing and customer service. After their third child was born, Ginger decided to pursue a long-held passion for real estate and became a licensed real estate agent with Shorewest, working as an associate on the Mary Wright Team. Ginger says, "I realized how much I love helping people be successful in reaching their personal goals. Success means different things to everyone, and I consider it my job in real estate to help people every step of the way."

As an avid basketball player, it is only fitting that Kevin started coaching the Whitefish Bay high school basketball team, when he began teaching in the district. Ginger now realizes why Kevin was so adamant about raising their family of three young girls in Whitefish Bay. "I am so in love with the traditions, the people and the proximity to downtown that Whitefish Bay offers. Some of our closest friends have been friends with Kevin since he was in grade school. Those friends are as close as family, and they weave a fabric that shapes your life and the lives of your children," says Ginger.

The Lazovik family is another boomerang example of a Whitefish Bay resident that grew up in the area, and loved it so much they returned to live, work and raise their family here. ●

WHITEFISH BAY HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

40 Historic Properties Receive Medallions

Forty properties in Whitefish Bay had medallions placed in their front sidewalks in 2015 in recognition of their architectural and historic importance to Village history. The list includes 35 homes, two schools, one church, a convent, and an apartment building.

This brings to 188 the total number of structures honored with medallions by the Whitefish Bay Historic Preservation Commission.

The Medallion Project, launched in 2009, draws attention to buildings that have been placed on the Village's Architectural and Historical Inventory (AHI). Properties are added to the AHI as they are identified, researched, and vetted for their architectural style or their place in Village history, and now number more than 200 structures.


Medallions are installed in conjunction with the Village's annual sidewalk pad replacement program.

Lexington Ave., and 1028 E. Lexington Ave. The four Flagg homes and the Uihlein mansion are listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The Uihlein mansion and the Flagg home at 908 E. Lexington Ave. are on the Whitefish Bay Registry of Historic Places. Also significant is 4737 N. Sheffield Ave., the home of architect John Edwards, who designed and built 17 "Vaulted Tudor" homes in Whitefish Bay. ●

Thank you for 20 years...and here's to 200 more.

As the year comes to a close, we also close out a whirlwind year here at North Shore Fire/Rescue. This year not only marked the 20th anniversary since the seven communities that make up the North Shore consolidated their fire and rescue services, but also some other very significant milestones.

This year, besides responding to more than 7,000 emergency calls for service, more than ever before in our twenty-year existence; we joined the elite ranks of only 218 fire and rescue agencies worldwide to achieve accredited status from the Commission on Fire Accreditation International. In addition the Public Policy Forum, an independent government watchdog organization who focuses on enhancing the quality of public policy decision making, analyzed the impacts of consolidation and found overall that NSFR is providing a higher level of service than that of pre-1995, and all communities are calculating a cost savings; affirming North Shore Fire/Rescue's position as an international model of successful consolidated public safety service.

In addition, North Shore Fire/Rescue took the lead on a countywide initiative aimed at increasing the number of citizens trained in CPR. Between January and September, more than 600 people have been

trained to provide Hands Only CPR and more than 130 have attended additional training with our staff and attained certification by the American Heart Association.

Additionally, nearly 100 child safety seats were inspected and installed by our trained personnel in partnership with the North Shore Health Department and nearly 150 home safety assessments were conducted for senior residents throughout the North Shore. In these assessments, more than 90% of the homes were found to have less than adequate detection and smoke alarms were installed free of charge through grants from Walmart and the National Fire Protection Agency.

None of these accomplishments would have been possible without YOU, our stakeholders. The support of the communities we serve is an integral part of what keeps us on the forefront of innovation. So, on behalf of all of the staff at North Shore Fire/Rescue, THANK YOU for your continued support. We wish everyone a safe and healthy holiday season and New Year. We look forward to future opportunities to exceed expectations and provide first-class service for years to come.



- ½ tsp salt

Reduce heat to 350 degrees and bake 25 minutes

Prick tops of each with a fork and bake 5 minutes more.
Ovens vary. You want a nice brown color.

Baklava

- 1 pound ground walnuts
- 1 ¼ cups white sugar
- 1 tsp. rose water (found at most health food stores; Fresh Market)

Mix the above together, blending well.

Melt ½ lb. salt-free butter and brush bottom of 9" x 13" cake pan

Working quickly:

Place 2 sheets of phyllo* dough in pan and brush top one with melted butter. Continue doing this until ½ the sheets in 1 pkg. of phyllo are used.

Spread the walnut mixture over the phyllo leaves.

Top with remaining phyllo, using the same process as before:

- 2 leaves, brushing the top one with melted butter.

Using a fine-bladed sharp knife, slice in approximate 2" width strips the long way, then AT AN ANGLE, cut 2" strips across the short way to create diagonal pieces.

Bake at 300 degrees for 45 minutes to a golden brown. Cool for 15 min.

In a 1 qt. sauce pan, place 2 cups white sugar, 1 cup tap water, 1 tsp. lemon juice, and 1 tsp. rose water. Stir while bringing to a boil and cooking for 10 minutes to make a light syrup. Pour syrup over the cooled Baklava.

Cool in fridge at least 1 hour.

**NOTE: Filo, phyllo, or filo pastry is a laminated dough of paper-thin sheets of unleavened flour, separated by a thin film of butter. It is used for making pastries in Middle Eastern and Balkan cuisines.*

Your Animal License Expires December 31!

If you share your life with a dog or cat, and live in Milwaukee County, your current animal license expires on Dec. 31 each year. If you do not yet have a license for your pet, this is the perfect time to start getting one annually.

When it comes to licensing, the first question we get is "Why do I need a license for my dog/cat?" Aside from the fact that it makes you and your best friend compliant with state and local laws, residents of Milwaukee County get some added benefits when they purchase a license and place the tag on their dog or cat's collar.

• If you're like us, your pet is part of your family. Licensing your pet acts as a form of insurance, enabling MADACC or a finder to

contact you if your pet becomes lost.

• MADACC offers all current dog/cat license holder's one Free Ride Home per calendar year! That means if we pick up your dog or cat, or it is brought in to us, and it is wearing the license tag AND we can reach you when we find the animal we will contact you to drop the animal off at your home or meet you at our facility to pick up your animal without charges.

• Dogs with licenses are able to purchase a Milwaukee County Dog Park permit. Milwaukee County has several wonderful dog parks that are only usable by rabies vaccinated and licensed dogs.

• Current rabies vaccines are required to

purchase a license. That means the more people that license their animal, the safer our community becomes! In the event that your dog or cat bites or scratches anyone, and their rabies vaccine is current, they may be eligible for an in home quarantine, rather than an impound which will save you money and not be as stressful for your animal.

To pick one up in person, remember we need your pet's current rabies information. If you need a new rabies vaccine, call us today to make an appointment for a low-cost vaccine at 414-649-8640. ●

Two Ways to Prepare Christmas Ham Your Guests will Rave About

Start with a good ham. I suggest a water-added semi-boneless if you prefer bone-in ham, or a dry-cure if you want boneless. Try to resist buying a pre-sliced ham in either case.



1. Use a pot large enough to hold your ham and enough water to immerse it. Bring the water, with the ham in it, to a low boil and boil until the temp reaches 135 degrees. This should take about 3 to 3 ½ hours depending on size.
2. Place a wire rack in a roaster to hold the ham up from the bottom. Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Before placing in oven and every ½ hour thereafter, baste the ham with SUGARED 7-UP (do not use sugar-free). Bake from 3 to 3 ½ hours, until it reaches 135 degree temp.

Holiday Salad

- 15 oz. can crushed pineapple (include juice)
- 1 pkg instant pistachio pudding
- 11 oz. can mandarin oranges – drained
- ½ cup maraschino cherries, no stems – drained
- 1 – 8 oz. Cool Whip



Mix pudding with pineapple – blending well
Add oranges and cherries – blend again
Fold in Cool Whip
Place in loaf pan and freeze






