Believes Family Time is the Best Time



If you happen to be a member of the now infamous Facebook page 'North Shore Homecycle' the name Lucy Judy, will surely be familiar to you. At this point, I am sure all the women are nodding their heads and grinning, while the men are scratching theirs, wondering what in the world is being referenced. While Lucy does have an eye for interior decorating and fashion, there is much more to the Judy family, and what they have overcome to now be the fabulous family of four that our community knows and loves.

While both Lucy and George Judy III, spent part of their youths in St. Louis, they did not meet until after college when a mutual friend introduced them in the fall of 1995. It was love at first sight, and they have been together ever since.

One evening while in a bookstore in St. Louis, they were perusing camp travel books, and the first place that caught their eye was Washington Island, Wisconsin. "We planned a trip there, and by the time we made it to Washington Island the weather was pretty crummy, but when we got onto the second ferry to Rock Island, the sun was coming out. We hiked to our site along the shore and George asked me to come down to the beach after we put up our tent. There he pulled out the most beautiful ring and proposed to me," said Lucy, while blushing like a schoolgirl with a new crush.

The couple planned a wedding at the old farmhouse of Lucy's parents who had recently relocated to Cedarburg. A unique side-story is that just one month prior to their wedding, movie producers used the farmhouse as the final scene in the movie *Novocaine*, starring Steve Martin. The scene was set as being in the south of France, and the Judy's kept as many of the scene props as possible to create the same romantic backdrop for their wedding.

Since Lucy & George both hail from big families, they hoped to start a big family of their own shortly after being married. George was promoted at work, and the couple jumped at the chance to relocate to Wisconsin for his new position.

A pregnancy never came, and quickly began consuming their lives. The couple started fertility treatments, and even through countless tests and surgeries, doctors could not pinpoint anything specifically wrong. When George took another job promotion, it relocated the couple to Neenah, and at this point, Lucy decided to quit her job and focus on fertility treatments in Milwaukee. "Ironically it was on these drives that I discovered Whitefish Bay, and just knew that someday I would love to live here," said Lucy.

The couple went through IUI treatments, and on the second try, Lucy was pregnant with triplets! This is a one in a million chance, and the couple were ecstatic about the news. Lucy tells the story of leaving the ultrasound, "We were elated, shocked and overwhelmed. I remember saying to George 'After this, we are going to China, there is a baby there for us.' He looked at me like I was truly insane, but I smiled and just knew

in my heart there was something to my internal feeling."

From the start it was a rough pregnancy for Lucy, which is to be expected when pregnant with triplets. Gender tests revealed that all three babies were girls and a beautiful baby shower was had for the family. Shortly after Lucy reached 21 weeks pregnant, she knew something was amiss. Following her instinct, she went into the hospital and it was discovered she had preeclampsia with HELLP Syndrome, which is a life-threatening diagnosis. Her doctor had no choice but to force her to deliver all three babies, and heartbreakingly none of them survived. "There are not enough words to describe how unbelievably devastating this was, how life changing it has been for both of us. But we learned to manage the pain, and five months later, decided it was time begin the adoption process to go to China and adopt our baby!" said Lucy.

For any adoption there is endless paperwork and steps to complete before

even being considered as possible parents. The couple did all that the agency required, and was told the wait would be about six months. The wait grew, and grew, with no end in sight. It was at this point the couple decided to pass the time by purchasing a small fixer-upper lake house located on none other than Washington Island, the same place they were engaged 7 years previously. They bought the house with the continued hope that one day they would have children to bring there and build memories with them.

A year later, the couple got the call that they have a beautiful daughter waiting for them in China. She was 7 months old and her name was Jiang Cheng Ling. As the baby girl's photo popped up on their computer screen, tears started rolling down the faces of George and Lucy because they both knew this was meant to be, and she was their

forever daughter. "She was our gift from our three girls, we were in love and we renamed our new baby Magnolia June Ling," said Lucy. The day that George and Lucy got that amazing news is called Referral Day and every year on that day they take a picture of Magnolia holding that very first photograph they saw of their daughter.

Two months after getting the call, they traveled to China to pick up their long-awaited daughter. "Our lives were suddenly filled with color again, she brought us more joy than anyone could ever imagine," said George with that fatherly twinkle in his eye.

A yearly tradition of the Judy family is to celebrate what they call "Gotcha Day" which is the day when they were given Magnolia from the orphanage. It is a family-focused day, and they let Magnolia pick any activity and which restaurant to have their dinner at to celebrate. When George and Lucy were in China they shopped for 18 special gifts, to give her one on every "Gotcha Day" year until she turns 18. Many of them are smaller tokens such as an umbrella or a purse. As she grows older the gifts will change to jewelry items including pearls and a jade bracelet that will be passed down from Lucy to Magnolia. "Jade is believed to protect you, and when Magnolia is old enough she will be given the jade bracelet I have worn since we went to China. She will be protected by the same jade that has protected me all

of these years," said Lucy.

The couple wanted to have more children and per agency rules, they had to wait a year to start the adoption process again. On the exact date a year later, Lucy was shocked to discover that she was pregnant. With this pregnancy, Lucy demanded to be tested for a blood disorder that she was sure contributed to the loss of her triplets. Sure enough, she tested positive for it and with treatment, she delivered a healthy full term baby boy, George L. Judy IV in spring 2009.

With their lives now filled with baby giggles and toddler tumbles, they wanted to relocate to Whitefish Bay. "I always knew that we would live here. It is similar




to the neighborhoods we grew up with in St. Louis, and it was where I wanted to raise our long awaited family. When my husband would make house hunting trips he said, "Lu, it's like a Norman Rockwell painting. There are kids ice skating in the park that is overlooking the lake!" When the kids were smaller we walked everywhere, and being able to just walk to the grocery store to pick up food for dinner never ceases to amaze me. Meeting friends at the library, attending art classes at Lydell, and ice skating in Klode park is pure magic. These are reasons why we love raising our family here," noted Lucy.

Fast forward to present day, and the Judy family has their picture-perfect life. Magnolia is now 9 years old, and has a passion for riding horses, playing soccer, tennis and figure skating. Their son, George, is 7 and stays active with baseball, hockey and enjoys fishing. The family visits their Washington Island lake house as often as time allows, and Lucy credits both children's love of nature due to their time spent outdoors at the lake. Coming full circle, Lucy has begun interior design for people who found her style to be impeccable while on the previously mentioned Facebook page. She wants to help people love the space they are living in and use what they already have, and of course, using a lot of thrift or estate sale find to help decorate a room with. George now works for Catalyst Exhibits as Director of Sales and when time allows, he loves to be a handy man around the house or out in his garage workshop where he makes furniture or fixes Lucy's thrifting finds.

"I feel like things have finally turned around for us. After all that we endured, we finally have the family that we dreamed of, live in a magical community, doing all the things that we love," said Lucy, while smiling and looking at her two beautiful children at the counter drinking homemade smoothies.





Five Steps to Being a Smart Home Buyer

Thinking about buying a home this spring? Perhaps your family is growing and you need another bedroom. Or maybe you're planning to downsize as the kids go off to college. Either way, it's important to be an informed and well prepared home buyer.

Establish Your Budget

Start by having a clear understanding of what you can afford. Many buyers focus on the price. But unless you're paying the full amount in cash the actual price isn't as tangible as your monthly payment. Your monthly payment (principal, interest, taxes, and insurance – PITI) is what you actually feel every month. Your REALTOR® and lender can help you work backwards to arrive at a purchase price that achieves that monthly payment.

Talk To A Lender

Work with a reputable lender to validate your financial qualifications, finalize budget, and ensure that there

are no credit score surprises. Also, lenders can help you identify the right loan program. For example, does it make sense to get a 30 year mortgage if you're going to be in the new house for only 5 years? Most lenders can walk you through the process in about 20 minutes by phone. Obtain a "pre-approval" letter from the lender after the conversation. Including a pre-approval letter with your offer has become a standard expectation. Many sellers won't consider offers that don't include a pre-approval letter.

Start developing a list of must-haves and nice-to-haves. Try to keep your criteria as broad as possible. There are no perfect homes so be ready to compromise. Think about your tolerance for doing renovations or adding-on to create your vision.

NORTH SHORE FIRE AND RESCUE

BASIC SAFETY TIPS CAN HELP REDUCE THE CHANCE OF HAVING AN ELECTRICAL FIRE IN YOUR HOME

A FIRE EXIT PLAN COULD SAVE YOUR LIFE

The key to surviving a fire in your home is to be prepared; all homes should be equipped with a working smoke detector on every level of the home. Smoke detectors should also be placed inside each sleeping area as well as directly outside of the sleeping areas. Although smoke detectors will provide early warning if a fire breaks out in your home, it will not guarantee that you will be able to safely exit your home. If primary exits are blocked, a second means of egress will be your only chance for survival. Developing a fire escape plan customized to your home will help your family determine the safest way to exit the home if a fire breaks out. Below are some general information on smoke detectors, and some general guidelines for developing a fire escape plan for your home. In an effort to keep our residents safe from fire and promote community safety, North Shore Fire/

Rescue will conduct a free courtesy home safety evaluation. This service is offered to residents of Bayside, Brown Deer, Fox Point, Glendale, River Hills, Shorewood, and Whitefish Bay.

TIPS FOR CREATING A FIRE ESCAPE PLAN

- Make a home escape plan. Draw a map of your home showing all doors and windows. Discuss the plan with everyone in your home.
- Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows leading outside open easily.
- Have an outside meeting place (like a tree, light pole, or mail box) a safe distance from the home where everyone should meet.
- Practice your home fire drill at night and during the day with everyone in your home, twice a year.



- Practice using different ways out
- Teach your children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
- Close doors behind you when you leave.
- GET OUT AND STAY OUT! Never go back inside for anything.
- Stay low and go. Crawl to an exit, the closer to the floor the cleaner the air, smoke and toxic gases rise.
- Call 911 from outside your home.

Garden Tips for Early Spring

Right about now, if you're a gardener, you are itching to get outside and plant! Let's get this garden party started, you're thinking. But not only is the ground solid from the winter and freezing temps for another month or more, there really are no outdoor plants to be found at local garden centers.

If you can't stand the wait any longer, you have some options that will satisfy your longing for green, at least temporarily. With a little more light everyday as we head into spring, indoor gardening will be ideal. Plant some seeds in small pots or flats, and, by the time you finally get outside, you'll have a nice start on the growing season and can take your pots outside or replant in the garden.

Most vegetables are easily started inside, with the exception of those that spread or are top-heavy like melons, squash, corn and asparagus. Start off with seeds of those that are easiest to grow, such as carrots, various lettuces, cress, radishes, dwarf tomatoes and shallots.

Herbs like dill, basil, fennel, oregano, parsley and rosemary are also a perfect

idea for indoor potting in spring, as the scent of the plants and the pretty foliage will help quench your gardening thirst. If possible, keep your herb pots in the kitchen, as they will enjoy a higher humidity from your cooking.

Be sure to put the pots in your sunniest location – south or southwest window – and water diligently, but do not flood the tiny seedlings. A warmer temp in their room is preferable, 72-75 degrees during the day and 60 at night. Use a good quality potting mix for all of your seeds, and enjoy some fresh greens indoors until you can finally go out and dig!

On December 4, 2014 Brad and Anna Depies' worst fear as parents had come true. Their sweet two-year-old daughter, Clara, had passed away in her sleep. Never did they think that when they put their beautiful and happy toddler down for the night, that it would be the last time they ever saw her alive. They were left with no answers as to why Clara never woke up.

Clara's death was ruled Sudden Unexplained Death in Childhood (SUDC), which occurs when an apparently healthy child beyond the age of 12 months dies without warning and without a known cause. Soon after their loss they learned of the SUDC Foundation, which provided



them with crucial support services, information and access to research. Being able to talk to others who have experienced SUDC helped them to not feel so alone. The SUDC Foundation was created in 2001 as part of a larger non-profit. Today it is its own foundation and is the only organization worldwide that is devoted solely to supporting families affected by SUDC and advocating for SUDC research to find answers for these unexplained losses. While the SUDC Foundation is making progress, much work and attention needs to be focused on this cause.

Brad and Anna created The Clara Depies Memorial in memory of their daughter, to raise awareness of SUDC and to hopefully help develop a future in which SUDC does not exist. The second annual Clara Depies Memorial Spring Fling will take place on Saturday, May 14, 2016, at Nicolet High School from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm. 
