Don't Let Mayhem Take Control of Your Summer Road Trip

Before you roll down the windows and crank the tunes, you'll want to make sure your ride is ready for adventure. Car trouble can bring your fun to a screeching halt and leave you with a hefty repair bill. Andrew McCabe from Allstate Insurance advises that, "While you can't prevent every mechanical breakdown, you can help to reduce the possibility of spending quality vacation time in the repair shop by ensuring that the items are in good working order."

Battery - According to AAA, failed batteries result in more calls to roadside service than anything else. "Check the battery to be sure the connection is clean, tight and corrosion-free. If your battery is three or more years old, have it checked to see if it needs replacement" says McCabe.

Fluids and Filters - Check the condition and level of engine oil and automatic transmission fluid. Also, don't forget to check the brake fluid, power steering fluid and windshield

washer reservoirs. If low, top off with the proper fluid. If you're due for an oil or transmission fluid change, have this performed before you leave. Change the air filter if you haven't done so recently. A dirty air filter is can impair engine performance and reduce fuel economy.

Tires - Tire inflation affects fuel economy and vehicle handling. Check tire pressure while the tires are at ambient temperature (cold) and adjust the pressure as necessary. Also, inspect your tires for adequate tread depth, cuts, nicks or side wall cracking. If the tire tread depth measures less than 2/32 of an inch, it's time for new tires. Uneven wear across the face of the tire can indicate worn suspension components or the need for a wheel alignment.

The WRONSKI FAMILY

Roots for the Home Team

If you live in Milwaukee, it's almost mandatory to be both a baseball fan, and specifically, a Milwaukee Brewers fan. We are in the land of beer, brats, baseball and the newest MLB official mascot, Hank the Ballpark Pup! The furry white dog won the hearts of both baseball, and non-baseball, fans everywhere when he was found extremely sick on one of the practice fields during the Brewers training camp in Arizona in 2014. Brewers players, coaches and staff obtained medical care for the pup, and the Brewers' communications department hunted for the original owner to no avail. All the while, the little pup was quickly becoming a story of his own, and was winning the hearts of baseball fans and animal lovers across the country. After being featured in *People Magazine*, on

the national news, and in *Newsweek for Kids*, Hank remained unclaimed, so the Brewers decided he had to come back "home" after training camp was over. He was brought to Milwaukee, and officially adopted by the Wronski family.

So how did this Whitefish Bay family end up with this sweet pup, who now has a calendar of events more full than most people? Marti Wronski, who is the Vice President and General Counsel for the Milwaukee Brewers would at first tell you that she was just "problem solving" when she told other Brewers executives that her family would adopt Hank if he remained unclaimed. "If you spent even a moment with Hank, you just knew that he had been loved by someone. His manners were terrible, but he could not get enough love and just wanted to play. I was certain he would be claimed the

moment word got out," said Marti. But when that didn't happen, the Wronskis were happy to add a second dog to their already busy home. While she has a job that most attorneys would covet, and sports-lovers envy, there's much more to the Wronski family than simply being Hank's loving owners.

Their story begins with Andy and Marti Wronski first meeting while working together as attorneys at Foley & Lardner in their Litigation department. Andy grew up in Bayview, attended Marquette University to complete his undergraduate degree, and then attended law school at the University of Minnesota. Marti hails from Neenah, and after moving to London for a few semesters and an internship she could not pass up, she graduated from St. Norbert College. She then attended the University of

Wisconsin Law School.

While Andy stayed on at Foley & Lardner, and is now the Vice-Chair of the firm's litigation department, Marti left the firm to become a professor at Marquette University Law School. This opportunity came at the perfect time, as the Wronskis were expecting their first son. Marti had always wanted to get back to academia and the Law School gave her more flexible hours, allowing her more time with her children. Marti would have been happy to remain at the Law School, where she enjoyed being engaged with students and faculty alike, but in 2003, Marti received a call from the Brewers now Chief Operating Officer, Rick Schlesinger, who asked Marti if she would fill in for a bit, when the Brewers previous general counsel had left. "We had two babies at

the time. I was thinking, no way, I cannot have two babies and two jobs. But with the idea that I was "filling in" squarely in mind, I agreed to help out. The weeks passed, and Rick asked me to stay. I love academia, but I had to make a decision. I went to the Dean of the Law School and said, "What do I do with this?" and he said, "Are you serious?! Take it for now, and come back to teach later." I am grateful to Dean Kearney for that advice to this day," said Marti.

The Wronskis now have four children, and all boys, Jonah (13), Luke (12), Sam (10) and Charlie (7). All of their boys attend St. Monica's and all are active with a variety of sports and interests. The couple was raising their boys in Cedarburg, but realized that as their family was expanding, they were heading

to Whitefish Bay for almost everything. "From haircuts, to playdates in the park, stopping by the bakery for a sweet treat, we just knew that Whitefish Bay was the place we should call home," said Marti. So in 2005, the family moved to Whitefish Bay, and have been in their beloved house on Bay Ridge ever since.

It's no surprise that all four Wronski boys enjoy playing baseball; In fact all but their youngest child plays for two teams. "The absolute best thing about our block, is that you can get to the Little League fields without crossing a street," said Marti. "There is truly nothing like the Little League program in this town. No one can help but smile, and know that something special is happening when watching kids and families together at Craig Counsell Park."

Volunteering in the community is another cornerstone of the Wronski family. "Heading to Arizona for Spring Training as a family allows us to bond over an activity we all love, and as Wisconsinites helps us remember that the warm weather, and baseball, are on the way. We all know that we are blessed to have a unique look into Brewers baseball. It is truly a childhood dream come true for me" Andy said. Door County is the other family favorite, and Hank is now recognized on the streets of Fish Creek!

The Wronski boys shared that faith, family and kindness are constant themes



from their mom and dad. Years ago, the family adopted a simple family motto of "Let's go Wronski Familie," spelled incorrectly on purpose, when their then 6-year-old son, Sam, spent hours designing a poster proudly reflecting this cheer. The poster still hangs in the Wronski kitchen, and even on stressful days, the motto is a perfect reminder of

what matters most.

Now when walking around Whitefish Bay, if you spot a fluffy white dog and think "Hey, that looks like Hank the Brewers pup," you just might be correct! He's a local Whitefish Bay celebrity, lucky enough to live with the fun-loving Wronski family. •





Hosting an exchange student through AFS Intercultural Programs has helped many Whitefish Bay families learn more about our world. AFS has been a leader in international high school student exchange for more than 65 years and is part of a worldwide AFS network. Students from 90 countries come to the US to study in high schools and live with host families.

Terri said that she and her husband wanted to host to “expand the world for our kids and expose them to different cultures. AFS students attend Whitefish Bay High School and are between 15- to 18- years old. They arrive in August and depart in June. The students are encouraged to participate in high school extracurricular activities and get involved with the community.

“The best thing about Whitefish Bay is the people. Everyone is very nice to each other. My days are always full of smiles from others and sounds of happiness. Even passing someone on the sidewalk can make me smile - just because a stranger said hi or smiled at me,” said Gam from Thailand.

Stephanie Schultz, Whitefish Bay AFS Chapter president, has been a single host mom to a male AFS student from Kuwait, a host sister to AFS students from Egypt, Norway and Switzerland and also an AFS exchange student to Austria.

DISTEMPER, PARVOVIRUS AND WHY YOU NEED TO PROTECT YOUR DOG

Many dog owners think that vaccines are not important to keep up with, or can be overlooked. Certainly, many animals do not get basic wellness care due to cost, the difficulty in transporting an animal to a veterinarian and even just plain life throwing other challenges and forgetting to take care of this important task.

Unfortunately, with warm weather upon us, more dogs are outside interacting with other dogs as well as being exposed to other dogs who have never been to a veterinarian or whom have traveled to Wisconsin from outside of the state and who can be shedding a disease unknown to the new owner.

Distemper is rare in Wisconsin but with so many animals traveling across the country to find homes, cases are becoming more frequent. Distemper spreads easily between animals who have not been vaccinated. A vaccination for distemper provides partial protection for your animal in just hours. Parvovirus is another disease that is easily spread between dogs, usually via fecal material that you would not even know your dog might have gotten into. A vaccine takes longer to provide protection from Parvovirus, so you should keep your animal away from other animals, especially the waste left behind, until they are fully protected. Most dogs can get full immunity against both of the diseases within 2 weeks, but just like people, some dogs will respond to one vaccine better than others. That is why veterinarians recommend to re-vaccinate a new adult dog in a home of unknown history two times 3-4 weeks apart the first year. Puppies should also follow this protocol every 3-4 weeks until they reach 16-20 weeks of age. It is not the number of vaccines a dog receives, as is normal perception, it is to this specific age.

These diseases are most common in puppies, but many dogs in our community never go to a veterinarian so adult dogs without protection are just as susceptible. Distemper and Parvovirus are not "curable". Veterinarians can only treat the symptoms for each disease and hope the animal is strong enough to pull through. This can cost thousands of dollars and often the cases can be fatal. This is especially tragic as a low cost vaccine would have prevented this from happening.

This time each year at MADACC we can see multiple animals each day being brought in who are suffering from Parvovirus and we want to remind owners that low cost vaccines are available at MADACC, Wisconsin Humane Society and many veterinarians around the county. As well MADACC and WHS have frequent low cost clinics over the summer where you can get your animal some protection and you can have peace of mind. Please contact MADACC at 414-649-8640 for information on upcoming clinics or to make an appointment to bring your best friend in for a vaccine today.


Scherrer Cares Buddy Bench Program BY LAURA USTANOVSKA

Also, he's performed on albums by Jean Luc Ponty, Frida Lyngstad (ABBA), Philip Bailey (Earth, Wind, & Fire), George Duke (Frank Zappa), and many others Stuermer continues to expand on his accomplishments today.






